Scripture Reading #1

(Exodus 17:1–7, Common English Bible)

Water from a Rock

17 The whole Israelite community broke camp and set out from the Sin desert to continue their journey, as the LORD commanded. They set up their camp at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. ² The people argued with Moses and said, "Give us water to drink."

Moses said to them, "Why are you arguing with me? Why are you testing the LORD?"

³ But the people were very thirsty for water there, and they complained to Moses, "Why did you bring us out of Egypt to kill us, our children, and our livestock with thirst?"

⁴ So Moses cried out to the LORD, "What should I do with this people? They are getting ready to stone me."

⁵ The LORD said to Moses, "Go on ahead of the people, and take some of Israel's elders with you. Take in your hand the shepherd's rod that you used to strike the Nile River, and go. ⁶ I'll be standing there in front of you on the rock at Horeb. Hit the rock. Water will come out of it, and

the people will be able to drink." Moses did so while Israel's elders watched. ⁷ He called the place Massah and Meribah, because the Israelites argued with and tested the LORD, asking, "Is the LORD really with us or not?"

Scripture Reading #2

(Philippians 4:1–9, Common English Bible)

Stand Firm in the Lord

4 Therefore, my brothers and sisters whom I love and miss, who are my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord.

Loved ones, ² I urge Euodia and I urge Syntyche to come to an agreement in the Lord. ³ Yes, and I'm also asking you, loyal friend, to help these women who have struggled together with me in the ministry of the gospel, along with Clement and the rest of my coworkers whose names are in the scroll of life.

⁴ Be glad in the Lord always! Again I say, be glad! ⁵ Let your gentleness show in your treatment of all people. The Lord is near. ⁶ Don't be anxious about anything; rather, bring up all of your requests to God in your prayers and petitions, along with giving thanks. ⁷ Then the peace of God that exceeds all understanding will keep your hearts and minds safe in Christ Jesus.

⁸ From now on, brothers and sisters, if anything is excellent and if anything is admirable, focus your thoughts on these things: all that is true, all that is holy, all that is just, all that is pure, all that is lovely, and all that is worthy of praise. ⁹ Practice these things: whatever you learned, received, heard, or saw in us. The God of peace will be with you.

Scripture Reading #3

(Matthew 21:23-32, Common English Bible)

Jesus' authority questioned

²³ When Jesus entered the temple, the chief priests and elders of the people came to him as he was teaching. They asked, "What kind of authority do you have for doing these things? Who gave you this authority?"

²⁴ Jesus replied, "I have a question for you. If you tell me the answer, I'll tell you what kind of authority I have to do these things. ²⁵ Where did John get his authority to baptize? Did he get it from heaven or from humans?"

They argued among themselves, "If we say 'from heaven,' he'll say to us, 'Then why didn't you believe him?' ²⁶ But we can't say 'from humans' because we're afraid of the crowd, since everyone thinks John was a prophet." ²⁷ Then they replied, "We don't know."

Jesus also said to them, "Neither will I tell you what kind of authority I have to do these things.

Parable of two sons

²⁸ "What do you think? A man had two sons. Now he came to the first and said, 'Son, go and work in the vineyard today.'

²⁹ "No, I don't want to,' he replied. But later he changed his mind and went.

³⁰ "The father said the same thing to the other son, who replied, 'Yes, sir.' But he didn't go.

31 "Which one of these two did his father's will?"

They said, "The first one."

Jesus said to them, "I assure you that tax collectors and prostitutes are entering God's kingdom ahead of you. ³² For John came to you on the righteous road, and you didn't believe him. But tax

collectors and prostitutes believed him. Yet even after you saw this, you didn't change your hearts and lives and you didn't believe him.
