The Reverend Doctor George Franklin DeFord Retired Elder of the Baltimore-Washington Conference The United Methodist Church

Rev. Dr. George F. DeFord is a native of Baltimore, Maryland. He is the son of the late George B. and Inez J. DeFord and the eldest of six siblings. He is married to Lila A. DeFord, affectionately known, "as his girlfriend and wife, who is one and the same." Together they are the parents of Andre, Dante, and Christopher, who deceased May 28, 2018. They are also the proud grandparents of Dante, Jr. (D2) and Christopher, Jr. (CJ).

Rev. DeFord benefits from undergraduate and graduate education from Morgan State University, Coppin State University, and Howard University, with Bachelor of Arts, Master of Education, Master of Divinity, and Doctor of Ministry respectively.

Rev. DeFord is in his thirty-eighth year of ordained ministry having served the following congregations and extension ministry: St. Mark's, Laurel, MD, 11 years; Mount Zion, Baltimore, MD, 3 years; Ebenezer, Washington, DC, 4 years; Metropolitan, Indian Head, MD, 8 years; Regional Guide, Southern Region, 3 years; and Smith Chapel, Pisgah, MD, 8 years.

Rev. DeFord is the founding president of the Morgan State University, Southern Maryland Alumni Chapter, chartered May 2005. From the George DeFord Scholarship Fund, nearly \$80,000 plus have been awarded to first-time awardees and continuing scholars, matriculating at Morgan State University.

Rev. and Mrs. DeFord make their home in Pomfret, Maryland.

Rev. and Mrs. DeFord are COVID-19 survivors. They attribute their recovery to the grace and mercy of Almighty God. Their sustaining verse of Holy Scripture is: "When thou passest through the waters, I will be with thee; and through the rivers, they shall not overflow thee; when thou walkest through the fire, thou shalt not be burned; neither shall the flame kindle upon thee." *(Isaiah 43:2 KJV)* Thanks be to God!

Our 130th Church Anniversary theme is "Striving for Excellence!" A scripture that reflect this year's theme is **Philippians 4:8**, which reads: "From now on, brothers and sisters, if anything is excellent and if anything is admirable, focus your thoughts on these things: all that is true, all that is holy, all that is just, all that is pure, all that is lovely, and all that is worthy of praise."



What a strange year 2020 has been. The 130th Church Anniversary

Committee started planning for this momentous Church Anniversary last year in 2019. We were not going to wait until the last minute because there was too much work to do. Many events and activities had been anticipated in preparation of this historic milestone. Who knew that Men's Day on March 8th would be the last Sunday we would gather in the Sanctuary to worship and fellowship together face-to-face? This Coronavirus pandemic has caused the entire world to do things differently. This includes the way we worship at St. Mark's!

Another nationwide epidemic of the Spanish Influenza took its toll on Laurel in 1918. According to the Laurel Leader, the pandemic created a serious condition and resulted in the loss of many lives. Schools and businesses in Laurel were closed until the flu epidemic ran its course. The written history of St. Mark's does not reflect whether St. Mark's or other Laurel churches were closed during that pandemic.

Rev. Lewis E. S. Nash was the pastor of St. Mark's during the Spanish flu pandemic in 1918. Rev. Nash was at St. Mark's from 1914–1926. He was a pastor beloved by his people; they followed his advice gladly. He was a man of deep spirituality who conducted prayer meetings on a regular basis. He was also known as a great preacher. It was stated in the church history, "When Rev. Nash was here everybody was happy, worked hard – real hard – and wanted to get ahead." His 12 years is the longest tenure at St. Mark's. Rev. Nash was known as a builder of churches. The most notable was the building of the new St. Mark's edifice in 1921. Our speaker today, Rev. Dr. George F. DeFord has the second longest at 11 years. In 1918, St. Mark's had only existed 28 years, which is very young in the life of a church.

Our ancestors were believers in the power of God. They were people who always looked forward, not backward! Even after suffering a pandemic in 1918, two years later in 1920, the St. Mark's trustees negotiated a mortgage agreement with the Board of Home Missions and Church Extension of the Methodist Church for \$2,500 to help defray the cost of erecting the new edifice. In 1921, the cornerstone for our current building was laid on the corner of Eighth and West Streets.

St. Mark's has been on this journey of faith since 1890. In that year Frank and Sarah Carter founded a house-front mission on West Street. From that time, St. Mark's has been the cornerstone of this community for 130 glorious years. This great church has been a sign of hope to the total community.

Since March 2020, St. Marks has continued our journey of Striving for Excellence. Because of technological advances, we have been able to stay connected by conducting our Sunday morning Worship Services virtually through ZOOM. The COVID-19 pandemic and closure of our church has not prevented us from having The Fellowship Hall, restrooms, and kitchen renovations completed. Just like in 1920, our trustees have kept our vision for the future alive. Our Wednesday night Bible Study experience is being held through a conference call. We are doing things differently, but we are still moving forward – moving toward what God wants us to be!
