Scripture Reading #1 Sister Cynthia (Exodus 17:1–7, Common English Bible)

17 The whole Israelite community broke camp and set out from the Sin desert to continue their journey, as the Lord commanded. They set up their camp at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. ² The people argued with Moses and said, "Give us water to drink."

Moses said to them, "Why are you arguing with me? Why are you testing the Lord?"

³ But the people were very thirsty for water there, and they complained to Moses, "Why did you bring us out of Egypt to kill us, our children, and our livestock with thirst?"

⁴So Moses cried out to the Lord, "What should I do with this people? They are getting ready to stone me."

⁵ The Lord said to Moses, "Go on ahead of the people, and take some of Israel's elders with you. Take in your hand the shepherd's rod that you used to strike the Nile River, and go. ⁶ I'll be standing there in front of you on the rock at Horeb. Hit the rock. Water will come out of it, and the people will be able to drink." Moses did so while Israel's elders watched. ⁷ He called the place Massah and Meribah, because the Israelites argued with and tested the Lord, asking, "Is the Lord really with us or not?"

Scripture Reading #2 Sister Cynthia (1 Corinthians 11:17–27, 33, Common English Bible)

¹⁷ Now I don't praise you as I give the following instruction because when you meet together, it does more harm than good. ¹⁸ First of all, when you meet together as a church, I hear that there are divisions among you, and I partly believe it. ¹⁹ It's necessary that there are groups among you, to make it clear who is genuine. ²⁰ So when you get together in one place, it isn't to eat the Lord's meal. ²¹ Each of you goes ahead and eats a private meal. One person goes hungry while another is drunk. ²² Don't you have houses to eat and drink in? Or do you look down on God's churches and humiliate those who have nothing? What can I say to you? Will I praise you? No, I don't praise you in this.

²³ I received a tradition from the Lord, which I also handed on to you: on the night on which he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took bread. ²⁴ After giving thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this to remember me." ²⁵ He did the same thing with the cup, after they had eaten, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Every time you drink it, do this to remember me." ²⁶ Every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you broadcast the death of the Lord until he comes.

²⁷ This is why those who eat the bread or drink the cup of the Lord inappropriately will be guilty of the Lord's body and blood.

³³ For these reasons, my brothers and sisters, when you get together to eat, wait for each other.

- ²⁰ That evening he took his place at the table with the twelve disciples. ²¹ As they were eating he said, "I assure you that one of you will betray me."
- ²² Deeply saddened, each one said to him, "I'm not the one, am I, Lord?"
- ²³ He replied, "The one who will betray me is the one who dips his hand with me into this bowl. ²⁴ The Human One goes to his death just as it is written about him. But how terrible it is for that person who betrays the Human One! It would have been better for him if he had never been born."
- ²⁵ Now Judas, who would betray him, replied, "It's not me, is it, Rabbi?" Jesus answered, "You said it."
- ²⁶ While they were eating, Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take and eat. This is my body." ²⁷ He took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from this, all of you. ²⁸ This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many so that their sins may be forgiven. ²⁹ I tell you, I won't drink wine again until that day when I drink it in a new way with you in my Father's kingdom." ³⁰ Then, after singing songs of praise, they went to the Mount of Olives.


