Scripture Reading #1Jaime Whitfield-Coffen (Exodus 32:1–14, Common English Bible)

32 The people saw that Moses was taking a long time to come down from the mountain. They gathered around Aaron and said to him, "Come

on! Make us gods who can lead us. As for this man Moses who brought us up out of the land of Egypt, we don't have a clue what has happened to him."

² Aaron said to them, "All right, take out the gold rings from the ears of your wives, your sons, and your daughters, and bring them to me." ³ So all the people took out the gold rings from their ears and brought them to Aaron. ⁴ He collected them and tied them up in a cloth. Then he made a metal image of a bull calf, and the people declared, "These are your gods, Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!"

⁵ When Aaron saw this, he built an altar in front of the calf. Then Aaron announced, "Tomorrow will be a festival to the Lord!" ⁶ They got up early the next day and offered up entirely burned offerings and brought well-being sacrifices. The people sat down to eat and drink and then got up to celebrate.

⁷ The Lord spoke to Moses: "Hurry up and go down! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, are ruining everything! ⁸ They've already abandoned the path that I commanded. They have made a metal bull calf for themselves. They've bowed down to it and offered sacrifices to it and declared, 'These are your gods, Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!'" ⁹ The Lord said to Moses, "I've been watching these people, and I've seen how stubborn they are. ¹⁰ Now leave me alone! Let my fury burn and devour them. Then I'll make a great nation out of you."

burn against your own people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and amazing force? ¹² Why should the Egyptians say, 'He had an evil plan to take the people out and kill them in the mountains and so wipe them off the earth'? Calm down your fierce anger. Change your mind about doing terrible things to your own people. ¹³ Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, your servants, whom you yourself promised, 'I'll make your descendants as many as the stars in the sky. And I've promised to give your descendants this whole land to

possess for all time." ¹⁴ Then the Lord changed his mind about the terrible things he said he would do to his people.

- 4 Therefore, my brothers and sisters whom I love and miss, who are my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord.

Loved ones, ² I urge Euodia and I urge Syntyche to come to an agreement in the Lord. ³ Yes, and I'm also asking you, loyal friend, to help these women who have struggled together with me in the ministry of the gospel, along with Clement and the rest of my coworkers whose names are in the scroll of life.

The Lord is near. ⁶Don't be anxious about anything; rather, bring up all of your requests to God in your prayers and petitions, along with giving thanks. ⁷Then the peace of God that exceeds all understanding will keep your hearts and minds safe in Christ Jesus.

⁸ From now on, brothers and sisters, if anything is excellent and if anything is admirable, focus your thoughts on these things: all that is true, all that is holy, all that is just, all that is pure, all that is lovely, and all that is worthy of praise. ⁹ Practice these things: whatever you learned, received, heard, or saw in us. The God of peace will be with you.

Scripture Reading #3 (Gospel)......Jaime Whitfield-Coffen (Matthew 22:1–14, Common English Bible)

22 Jesus responded by speaking again in parables: ² "The kingdom of heaven is like a king who prepared a wedding party for his son. ³ He sent

his servants to call those invited to the wedding party. But they didn't want to come. ⁴ Again he sent other servants and said to them, 'Tell those who have been invited, "Look, the meal is all prepared. I've butchered the oxen and the fattened cattle. Now everything's ready. Come to the wedding party!" ⁵ But they paid no attention and went away—some to their fields, others to their businesses. ⁶ The rest of them grabbed his servants, abused them, and killed them.

The wedding party was full of guests. ¹¹ Now when the king came in and saw the guests, he spotted a man who wasn't wearing wedding clothes. ¹² He said to him, 'Friend, how did you get in here without wedding clothes?' But he was speechless. ¹³ Then the king said to his servants, 'Tie his hands and feet and throw him out into the farthest darkness. People there will be weeping and grinding their teeth.'

Darlene is a native of Anne Arundel County, born in Shady Side, Maryland to the late Charles McKinley and Myrtle Matthews Thompson. She now resides in West River, Maryland and is the widow of the late Rev. Johnnie Washington, the mother of two sons, John R. Miller, Jr. and Quincy J. Miller, raised one granddaughter Michelle Miller Turner as her daughter and has eight other grandchildren and three great grands.

Darlene was educated at a time of segregation in Anne Arundel
County, therefore was educated in all black schools; Shady Side
Elementary, graduated from Wiley H. Bates High School,



Annapolis, Maryland and Cortez Peters Business College, Washington, DC. She has numerous certifications from Anne Arundel Community College in Computer Software and Principles of Management and Supervision.

Darlene retired after working 38 years. She was employed from 1964 to 1972 as the first black female hired by the Davidson Transfer and Storage Company, Washington, D.C. The last thirty years of employment was with Anne Arundel County. In 1984 she was promoted as the first African-American female to hold the position of Recreation Supervisor. It was in this capacity that she provided a broad scope of quality and innovative recreation and enrichment programs for the citizens of Anne Arundel County, for which she received numerous awards and citations and was recognized as the Department's Employee of the Year on several occasions. She is especially proud to have provided employment opportunities for so many African-American youths in Severna Park, Downs Park, Annapolis, Quiet Waters Park and in the South County region of Anne Arundel County.

Darlene serves her local church as well as the Baltimore-Washington Conference of the United Methodist Church as the Registrar for the Annual Conference. She is the Lay Leader, Certified Lay Speaker, and former Church Administrator for Franklin U.M.Church, Churchton, Maryland. Darlene is the former Administrator of the Har-Pearl Spruill Foundation, Inc. Summer Enrichment Program held at five church locations in Annapolis and in the Churchton-Shady Side community. She has been dedicated to the youth of her church, community, and with the Annapolis District and Baltimore-Washington Conference, serving as Registrar and a team leader with the BWC Youth ROCK Retreat.

Presently she is serving as the Treasurer of the Annapolis Chapter, Delicados, Incorporated, Financial Secretary and past President of the National Delicados, Inc. This is a civic organization that provides academic scholarships to high school graduates, financially supports National Council of Negro Women, Community Health Projects, National Negro College Fund, Sickle Cell Foundations, HIV/AIDS, and disaster projects, i.e. American Red Cross among other community outreach projects. Darlene serves on several community Boards: The Community Health Center of Parole, Inc., Bay Community Health, and the Har-Pearl Spruill Foundation, Inc.

Recognition for her volunteer work in the community, she was the recipient of numerous awards to include the 2009 NAACP Freedom Fund Award, 2019 Sigma Gamma Rho Eta Zeta Sigma Chapter's Woman of Excellence Award, 2020 General Assembly Citation for dedication and

advocating for the Southern Anne Arundel County Community, 2021 Fannie Lou Hamer Award sponsored by the MLK, Jr. Committee.

Darlene spends most of her time serving the community, whether it is church, civic organizations, or personal interests. She has a servant lifestyle; it is part of her being. As long as she can remember, her parents and paternal grandparents always outreached to the community; taking others in their home to live, raising farm animals and planting fields of vegetables to feed others. Her father and grandfather employed and trained others in their trade of oystering and building boats in the family's former marina on Chester Ave in Eastport. She says that service to others has been ingrained in her; it is what her parents taught her from an early age and what God has commanded that she do!
